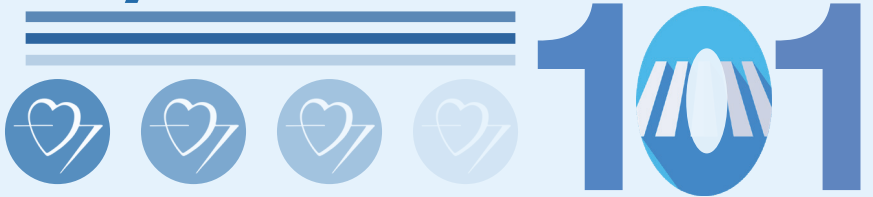














Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon



Located at Gary Lane & Stadium Road

A Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB), also known as a High Intensity Activated Crosswalk (HAWK), is a traffic control device which makes it safer to cross busy streets for pedestrians. The difference between a PHB and a typical traffic signal is that the PHB is dark/inactive until activated by a pedestrian.
