Nick Salinas, a member of the MORES Board stated that County Supervisor Rob Poythress had wanted to attend this evening's meeting but was in Sacramento on County business. Mr. Salinas stated that the Esperanza Village housing project would soon be exiting the Construction Financing phase and transitioning into the permanent financing structure. They will be realizing a total estimated cost savings of \$945,000 and those monies will be returned to the City of Madera for allocation into the City of Madera Housing Element. The projected close date for getting documents recorded and the title updated is the end of this month. Mr. Salinas thanked the City Council for their service and partnership and hoped there would be many others in the future.

A gentleman (no name given) stated that as a property/business owner in the area if they (property/business owners) have problems with their sidewalks, they have been told to take care of it after hours or on the weekend. He asked that other issues that the Downtown Association has been working on in the downtown area are also being taken care of such as skylights, etc. City Engineer Keith Helmuth stated that this project was only for the sidewalks and not other issues.

John Barsotti asked why do they want to make sidewalks wider? City Engineer Keith Helmuth responded that wider sidewalks would enable more pedestrian traffic as well as allow businesses to use them for outside dining and placing of artwork. It would create a sense of community in the downtown area. Mr. Barsotti stated it would probably be a waste of concrete.

She highlighted the Black History Celebration at McNally Park and thanked all the agencies that attended and for their support and service. Councilmember Evans stated that Marcela Andrews was recognized as the guest of honor for 2023.

Mayor Pro Tem Mejia mentioned the Black History Month Events taking place in Madera. She mentioned a solo-performance show by Joshua Slack, called Code Switch and her desire to bring his show to Madera. She announced that the International Women's Day event will be hosted at Matilda Torres High School on March 9th and encouraged the public to attend.

Councilmember Villegas thanked Councilmember Evans for her involvement in the Black History Month event. He also congratulated the Santeufemia family on 50 years in business and being a part of the community.
